Following are brief descriptions of each award winner.

Jane Eaton will receive the Marty Stein Friend of Service recognition. Eaton has gone above and beyond her call of duty in motivating the people around her, her outstanding performance as a principle, leader, and friend, strengthening the community and over all excellence. Jane has encountered multiple challenges through her years of service such as helping families and community members realize that they can make a positive difference.

Kimberly Pufahl, Wausau, will receive the Governor's Community Service AmeriCorps Participant Award. Currently Pufahl is serving with the New Horizons Charter School for At-risk middle school Students. At New Horizons Kimberly is engaged with the students in different ways. Concerning academics she assists with classroom assignments, such as leading a small group reading discussions. The educational experience at this school also involves teaching life skills. Kimberly, is interested in making a difference in her hometown community of Wausau. Kimberly organizes many yearly events to include Martin Luther King, Jr. Day celebration, World Global Youth Service Day, AmeriCorps Week, and the list grows each year.

Michael Castaneda, AmeriCorps*VISTA will receive the Governor's AmeriCorps*VISTA participant award. Castaneda works with the Department of Public Instruction, serving at Parents Plus, Inc. in downtown Milwaukee and is assigned to Kosciuszko Monterrori and Middle School. Michael works tirelessly to promote and encourage open communication with the parents of Kosciuszko, even though it is often a challenge as many families do not speak English. Michael addresses the need to improve student success through institutionalizing family involvement in low-income neighborhoods in Milwaukee.

Rob Wilkinson, RSVP of Rock County will receive the Governor's Senior Corps Participant award. Service to community is not stranger to Wilkinson. Rob's past employment as a police officer alerted him to the needs of his community in ways we may not be aware of. His thirty-one years on the police force has brought him this knowledge. That along with his desire to remain active has allowed him to become an important member of the many committees and organizations he is a part of. Every community has a need for volunteers. Volunteers that can help serve, strengthen and make a difference in their community. Rob Wilkinson is that type of volunteer. You might see Rob distributing food, helping to insure a safe community at a Red Cross, AARP, or VOAD meeting or activity, giving out information to people in need at United Ways' First Call or greeting visitors to Janesville's Visitor Information Booth and he is always making sure that seniors have knowledge and information on issues concerning them. In 2007, he put over 12,000 volunteering miles on his car. He is a man who cares and gives 100% to issues concerning his community. From September 2006, through December 2007 Rob has volunteered 4,046 volunteers' hours. If volunteer hours were paid at the rate of \$18.77 an hour (current assessment) then Rob's volunteer time would equate to \$75,000 for that time period. During that same time period Rob has assisted 2,289 people through his volunteer efforts.

PAWS Program, is an amazing community partnership of PASS, ARC of Wisconsin, The Waisman Center, and Serve Wisconsin. The goals of PAWS include engaging people with disabilities in inclusive community service projects that target environmental improvements, uniting AmeriCorps members with youth and people with disabilities in team building activities that foster mutually beneficial relationships, and sustaining the

projects by creating a core planning team comprised of AmeriCorps members, people with disabilities, service providers and others in the disability community. To excite the disabilities community about service, PAWS held a recruitment dance that attracted over 40 people. Propelled by a strong commitment, PAWS is continually planning service events to include people with disabilities. For example, PAWS partnered with Habitat for Humanity to winterize homes in Milwaukee, helped construct an accessible playground in Sun Prairie, played games with seniors at an assisted living home on New Year's Eve, and cleaned dog parks.

Stan Potts, will receive the Governor's Service-Learning Recognition for his outstanding work with service-learning projects. Potts initiated grants and projects to promote service-learning in K-12 education in Wisconsin and nationally. He created the 4-Point Test for Service-learning to help educators and policy makers understand that service-learning is different from community service and volunteerism. He participated in the early work of the Wisconsin National and Community Service Board and introduced DPI to VISTA and AmeriCorps, which enabled DPI to strengthen communities. Potts assisted in the creation of the current Community Learning and Partnerships team at DPI.

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
